The goal of the EMS Visions Leadership Camp is to develop providers into leaders in a fun and cost efficient manner. While we would love to accommodate everyone that has expressed interest, there is only so much space available, so attendance at these camps will be by invitation only.

As well, because we are trying to keep this on a budgetary level that most EMS Professionals can afford, this camp is not being held in a five star resort; nor will we have chef prepared meals. It might be hot or cold. There may be bugs, snakes, and whatever else the outdoors brings. We will literally be camping, either in cabins, recreational vehicles, or tents (whatever you choose). Daily sessions will be conducted INDOORS (in a temperature controlled environment).

There will also be fun, networking, camaraderie building, and lots of learning!

You are welcome to bring your fishing gear, boats, kayaks, canoes, or whatever else you'd like to enjoy in the evenings.

Each attendee will be responsible for securing their own camp site, RV site, or cabin.

Cabins (\$80-90/night +entrance fee)

Cabins sleep 2-4 people. They are equipped with water, electricity, A/C and heater, toilet and shower, refrigerator, coffee pot, stove with oven, double bed, and linens.
 A 4-person cabin has 2 double beds

Campsites (\$12-\$25/night)

Tent sites with water are \$12/night (+entrance fee) restrooms & showers nearby, lantern post, picnic table

Tent sites with electricity are \$15/night (+entrance fee) 30/20-amp electric, restroom & showers nearby

RV sites with electricity are \$15-\$20/night (+entrance fee) 50/30/20-amp electric, water, with tent pad

Full Hookup RV Campsites are \$25/night (+entrance fee) 50/30/20-amp electric, water, sewer

EMS Pathfinders will provide water and Powerade/Gatorade during lunch, dinner, and learning sessions. We will also provide dinner the night of arrival and lunch and dinner on following days of camp; however, attendees will be broken into groups to prepare the menu (teamwork makes the dream work and keeps tummies full).

Payment is due upon attendees' registration to the camp, unless other arrangements have been made.

First consideration will be given to smaller departments that want to send more than 1 person.
